

Carbon Monoxide Alarms Now Required By Law

It's now the law in Ontario to install carbon monoxide (CO) alarms in your home if you have a fuel-burning appliance or an attached garage.

Single-family homeowners and owners of residential buildings that contain no more than six suites have until April 15, 2015 to comply with the law. Owners of residential buildings with more than six suites have until October 15, 2015 to comply.

The law will be enforced by Waterloo Fire Rescue. Failure to comply with the CO alarm requirements could result in a Part I Provincial Offenses Act ticket or a Part 3 charge in a court of law.

Understanding the Importance of Mortgage Insurance

For those of you that have obtained your mortgage insurance as a value added service from your banker, you may want to have another look at your options. You may have thought that you purchased peace of mind, however, there are some things you should know about the insurance you bought at the bank. The coverage that you have been approved for isn't necessarily guaranteed. The bank's policy is not underwritten until the time of the claim. This means you potentially could be denied the funds later on when you actually need them. If you truly want to protect your investment, you need to purchase a private term life insurance policy to cover the outstanding balance of your mortgage. This can only be purchased from an insurance company.

If you truly want to protect your investment, you need to purchase a private term life insurance policy.

An insurance company underwrites the policy when you apply,

so you know if you qualify up front. There will not be any surprises when you make a claim later on. The policy will pay the full amount it was taken out for at time of application to the beneficiary that you chose. The bank's policy only covers the remaining balance of your mortgage, not the amount you selected at the policy start date (and paid premiums towards). The bank also only pays to the bank; there is no beneficiary option.

Let's say you took insurance in the amount of \$200,000 to cover the balance of the mortgage. Fifteen years later, you owe only \$100,000 on the mortgage. A bank's policy would pay only the \$100,000 to the bank and clear your debt with them, assuming your claim is not denied for any underwriting reason. A private term life policy would honor the entire \$200,000 and pay to your beneficiary who could then use part of the funds to pay off the mortgage and the rest for other expenses such as funeral costs and clearing up other debts. The difference speaks for itself.

Hanging Wall Art Fabulously

Keep it Simple

When it comes to mats and frames, the easiest way to go is with white mats and black frames. Have all of your art framed the same way. Or, if your space is neutral, and you feel adventurous, the frames could be a variety of colours in a coordinated palette, to liven up the space.

Hanging Levels

Average eye level is considered 58 inches high. The centre of the artwork, not the top of the piece, should be at that height. Hanging art a bit lower in kids' rooms is a great idea because their eye level is lower. If a room is mostly used for sitting, then you can hang the artwork lower to keep it at eye level.


Grid Patterns

Symmetrical grid pattern. Keep about 2 to 3 inches between frames. Use a level, a ruler, and some large newsprint paper as a template.

Salon style is loose, informal and artsy. Centre the largest piece of art in the middle or just off the middle, and then place the rest of the art around it in an interesting pattern. Cut out the shape of each piece of art in brown craft paper and tape it to the wall to test out placement options.

Plain, bare frames with no art also look wonderful hung salon style. Buy frames at a thrift shop, remove the glass, mat and cardboard and paint all of them one colour. Voila. An inexpensive custom art installation.
