

OneList Waterloo Region now available

Did you know that Waterloo Region now has a unified waiting list for licensed child

Create an account and simply indicate which child care providers wait lists you want to be added to and the date you are seeking care.

Once your account has been activated, you will need to provide information about you and your family on the application form. The information you provide will be used to suggest early learning and child care options. You may place your child's name on as many lists as you choose. The ELCC program will contact you when a space becomes available.
