Join Our Volunteer Community

Clair Hills Community Association is a very dedicated and fun group of residents who care about each other and the neighbourhood they live in.

Why should I volunteer with the CHCA?

Volunteering is one of the easiest ways to give back to your community and it's a great way to meet your neighbours. Our volunteers have all become friends and you'll find them meeting each other for coffee, hosting UFC parties in their living rooms, and organizing play dates. Volunteering is also a great way to build your resume, gain practical experience, and network. Our volunteers receive a special nametag, a volunteer t-shirt and special recognition throughout the year including a volunteer appreciation dinner.

How much time does it take?

One to five hours a month. Sometimes it's less and sometimes it's a little more. We meet every month (with a break in the summer) and hold an Annual General Meeting every May.



The Clair Hills Community Association works in partnership with the City of Waterloo as agreed in the terms of their Affiliation Service Agreement.

Neighbourhood Reps: A New Way To Volunteer!

We've got an exciting new volunteer role to share. If you're looking for a unique way to get involved but that doesn't require a lot of time, consider becoming a **Clair Hills Neighbourhood Rep (NR)**. All that's required is delivering our newsletter a couple of times a year to your neighbours in a designated area of Clair Hills, and introducing new neighbours to the CHCA with a special welcome package that we provide! We have a special gift for our Neighbourhood Reps too. If you're interested, email volunteer@clair-hills.ca for more information.

How it works:

Each NR is responsible for a designated area in Clair Hills. Ideally the area includes the personal street of the NR and any surrounding streets that require support. Once assigned to a street(s), the NR then carries out the following responsibilities:

- Delivers Welcome Packages to new residents, as required
- Monitors house sales and notifies CHCA when a welcome package is required
- Delivers the Clair Hills Connection (printed newsletter) door to door, twice annually*

- Notifies the CHCA of any issues on their street(s). Examples can include recurring bylaw infractions, unusual activity such as car break ins or prowlers already reported to police, safety concerns such as traffic, etc.
- Attends a minimum of one CHCA meeting per year

* NRs will be provided ample notice if the distribution frequency changes.

Role of the CHCA:

- The CHCA will provide training materials and inperson training (when required) to ensure each NR understands their responsibilities and has the tools and resources to carry out their duties.
- The CHCA will provide regular communications with NRs to ensure they are up-to-date on all CHCA activities and changes. The CHCA will share meeting minutes and extend all regular meeting invites to NRs.
- The CHCA will provide each NR with a copy of the welcome package including the CHCA travel mug. The CHCA will provide an @clair-hills.ca email address, magnetic nametag and access to its electronic file share on Dropbox.
- The CHCA will include NRs in annual volunteer appreciation activities.

Little Libraries: Expand Your Reading Opportunities

Little Libraries of Kitchener-Waterloo is a loosely organized group of people who are really into the idea of Little Free Libraries

Our goal is to make buying/building, setting up and maintaining your Little Library as easy as possible. Here are some of our reasons for wanting a Little Library... what are yours?

Neighbourhood Bonding – When you put out a Little Library, you are exchanging ideas and opinions with your neighbours. As they walk by, they can take or leave books, and perhaps start a conversation about the books with you. A Little Library is a great way to engage those who live near to you. Put out books on art history, or on the biology of rabbits! Put out 6 copies of a book that you want all of your neighbours to see! You're the steward of your Little Library; you get to curate it!

Immediate Availability of Books – While we do have a great set of libraries in Waterloo, there is a tangible benefit to having a book immediately available for perusal and taking, with no registration or process required. See a book that intrigues you? Just take it! Don't like it? Drop it back off, put it in another Little Library, or just give it to a friend. No need to head over to the main library or bookstore; the book is right there, just for you! You may pick up a book that you never intended to read, that you might have glossed over otherwise.

A Marker of What We Believe – Just the presence of Little Libraries, perhaps even more so than the books in them, is a big part of the message. Having Little Libraries all around town, and seeing them on a daily basis, reinforces that we in this community truly value literacy, thought, education, opinion, engagement. We value knowledge over ignorance. We value our millennia of personal experiences. In short,





we value books! What better way to say that than to display them prominently?

Personal Engagement – When we walk through residential areas, often we see houses that are very much separate from the public roadways we walk along. We value the notion of private property, and our propriety doesn't allow us to interact with what we see. A Little Library is a way for a homeowner to reach out, to say "You are welcome here. I want to engage with YOU."

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WRPS Online Reporting

Did you know you can report certain incidents online using the Waterloo Region Police Services Online Reporting tool? Online reporting can include:

- Damage to Vehicle (other than by collision and under \$5000)
- Theft (Under \$5000)
- Lost Property (Under \$5000)
- Mischief/Damage to Property (Under \$5000)
- Theft from Vehicle (Under \$5000)

If you consider your incident an emergency, call 9-1-1 immediately. If your incident is NOT an emergency and does NOT meet all of the ONLINE reporting criteria above, call 519-653-7700 or attend your closest police station.






