PLAY SAFE

- Walk & Play in groups
- Always let your parents know where you are
- In an uncomfortable situation, trust your feelings, say "NO!" and tell someone
- If approached by a stranger, stay two arm-lengths away; don't be afraid to yell and make a fuss
- When your life is in danger do whatever it takes to get away
- Use the appropriate safety gear for the appropriate sport
- When biking, follow the rules of the road
- When walking walk facing traffic
- If out after dark wear light coloured clothing and watch for vehicles

OTHER SAFETY TIPS

Only call 911 in an emergency. No one should turn in a false alarm to bring the fire department, police or ambulance. While they are responding to this false alarm, there may be people who really need these services. These people could die because there was no one to assist them.

Every home should have a flashlight to use in an emergency.

Children should not play on or around farm machines and should not be allowed to ride on them or drive them.

DO NOT go on or near railway tracks.

DO NOT play with baby buggies or strollers, even if there is no child in it.

If you have a key to your house be careful not to let anyone else borrow or use it. Do not tell anyone where you carry your key. DO NOT go into your home unless you are sure it is safe to do so.

Be a good buddy and help to keep your friends safe too!

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- Always fly kites away from power lines
- Never climb trees near power lines
- Stay away from electrical equipment and never go near downed power lines. If you need help, ask an adult to contact the power company
- Stay away from the work area and the truck where linemen are working
- Be extra careful during an electrical/ lightening storm
