WHAT IS NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

The Neighbourhood Watch Program is a formal network of caring citizens who communicate with their neighbours and police regarding their community. The Program asks you to be more aware and alert to the activity in your area.

WHY DO YOU NEED NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH?

Your security depends upon you and your neighbours. No Police Service can effectively protect life and property without the support of the citizens it serves.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO BE A MEMBER?

Any adult group representing households in the same geographical area can apply. Contact the Nieghbourhood watch civilian board of directors and indicate your interest to participate. You will be assisted in setting the boundaries for your particular group.

WATCH CAPTAINS

Each Neighbourhood Watch area will have a Watch Captain who must be at least 18 years of age. They will assist in coordinating the formation meeting, and maintaining up to date membership lists for their group.

THE PROGRAM

Kitchener, Waterloo and Cambridge each have their own civilian board of directors who control and administer the Neighbourhood Watch Program for their respective areas.

Any inquiries should be directed to your local neighbourhood watch office.

Participants will be invited to a meeting to discuss residential security, and effective crime reporting.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

The Neighbourhood Watch Alert Dialer is our computer system that allows Neighbourhood Watch Program to deliver phone messages to all of its participants. These messages will advise members of crime occurring in their particular area, and provide them with crime prevention tips to better protect themselves.

Neighbourhood Watch Membership

Any resident living in the boundaries of the Waterloo Regional Neighbourhood Watch of Division 3 and requesting membership in the organization is eligible for membership.

The achievement of the goals of Neighbourhood Watch is best served by the active participation of citizens in this organization.

The value of a caring community is lost until a Watch Captain is found and willing to organize their community as a Neighbourhood Watch Group.

- The person seeking membership in our organization is encouraged to organize a Neighbourhood Watch Group in the boundaries of their choice.
- We do recommend a minimum of one block. However, both sides of their street should be included.
- It is our recommendation to raise interest for membership at the group's left and right hand side streets and possibly include the street behind this new perspective group.
- The person willing to organize the new group will be the designated Watch Captain for his/her group.
- Each candidate for the position of the Neighbourhood Watch Captain must be at least 18 years old and willing to have a Police and a Criminal Record Check conducted a no cost to him/her.
- Contact the Waterloo Regional Neighbourhood Watch office at 650-8500 ext. 3380 to make the necessary arrangements.

Conditions for acceptance of the Watch Captain candidate

- As a condition for acceptance as a Watch Captain the candidate must have the trust and cooperation of his / her community.
- The candidate must complete a 'Police Check' at no cost to him / her.
- After the return of the 'Record Checks' the candidate must complete all the required Neighbourhood Watch Application forms.
- 4: Any approval or rejection will be at the discretion of the Neighbourhood Watch Organization and it's Administrator.
- The Board of Directors reserves the right to review any Watch Captain position.
